

# Porcelain Berry

*Ampelopsis glandulosa* var. *brevipedunculata*



## General Description:

- Vine: > 25' long, up to 4" thick
- Leaves: Toothed edges and pointed tips; heart-shaped/deeply lobed; leaf undersides are hairy. **A lot of variation in shape**
- Stem: New stems are squarish, light green, & hairy with **nodes & tendrils**; older stems develop **gray dots**, rough bark, **pith = porcelain white**

## Prominent Features:

- Fruits: **Shiny, speckled berries** that resemble porcelain. Berries can be a variety of colors (**pale blue, lilac, pink, cream, violet, bright turquoise, etc.**)
- White pith

## How to Remove:

- Properly contain berries first to prevent seed dispersal
- Hand-pull young vines

## Look Alikes: Native Grape Species

- **Brown pith** with no gray patches/dots on bark
